The RINA-d'Amico "Student Naval Architect Award" was awarded today by the Royal Institution of Naval Architects – a professional British association of naval architects founded in 1860 in London - in partnership with the d'Amico Group to Federica Fregosi, engineer, who recently graduated in naval architecture from the University of Genoa. The award ceremony this year was carried out remotely due to the

The "Student Naval Architect Award" is granted by the Royal Institution of Naval Architects in more than 30 universities all over the world, including the historic University of Genoa, chosen due to its great tradition and cooperation with the naval world.

The historic ties between the d'Amico Group and the maritime academic world is aimed at shaping the future of shipping along with young people who have received excellent training and international institutions.

In order to promote and encourage the exchange of technical and scientific information for the design and building of ships, the Royal Institution of Naval Architects, the professional British association of naval architects founded in London in 1860, built up a relationship with the Naval Architecture Department of the University of Genoa over the years.




