





Fifteenth edition of the "Student Naval Architect Award"



The RINA-d'Amico "Student Naval Architect Award" was awarded last week by the Royal Institution of Naval Architects – a professional international association of naval architects founded in London in 1860 – in partnership with the d'Amico Group to Rebecca Benassi, who recently graduated in Naval Architecture from the University of Genoa.

The award ceremony this year, as in 2020, was carried out remotely due to the pandemic, with the online the participation of Chris Boyd, Chief Executive of RINA, Maurizio d'Amico, President of RINA, Francesco Rotundo, d'Amico Group HR Director, Professor Carlo Podenzana and Professor Paola Gualeni, of the Naval Architecture faculty of the University of Genoa, together with all the students.



The "Student Naval Architect Award" is awarded by the Royal Institution of Naval Architects in more than 30 universities all over the world, including the historic University of Genoa, selected for its great tradition and collaboration with the shipping industry.

The historic ties between the d'Amico Group and maritime academia is aimed at shaping the future of shipping together with young people who have received excellent training at international institutions.

With a view to promoting and encouraging exchange of technical and scientific information for the design and building of ships, a partnership has been consolidated over the years between the Royal Institution of Naval Architects, the professional international association of naval architects founded in London in 1860, and the Naval Architecture Department of the University of Genoa (DITEN).

During the event the Chief Executive of RINA, Chris Boyd, welcomed a University of Genoa student to the organisation, who will represent the student body and actively participate in the















life and activities of the Royal Institution. The opportunity to provide a "student representative" is granted to five universities worldwide.


